Attend Today, Achieve Tomorrow

Interacting with teachers and classmates in school is the most effective way for students to learn and reach their full potential. Time spent in school also plays a key role in ensuring children's safety while providing them with access to extracurricular activities and support services. This underscores the importance of regular school attendance and the Government's commitment to tackling the issues that cause some children to miss school without valid reasons.

Students with higher attainment at KS2 generally had lower absence rates compared to those with lower attainment. For instance, pupils who did not meet the expected standard in reading, writing, and maths in 2019 had an overall absence rate of 4.7% across the key stage, compared to 3.5% for those who met the standard and 2.7% for those who exceeded it.

Overall, as the percentage of missed sessions during KS2 increases, attainment levels at the end of the stage tend to decrease. Among pupils with no absences during KS2, 83.9% reached the expected standard, compared to 40.2% of pupils who were persistently absent.
