use hand sanitiser once

12. Staff and pupils with
COVID19 symptoms, a
positive LFD or PCR test
result should self-isolate in
line with the stay-at-home
guidance. This isolation
also applies to persons
required to quarantine
after returning from
designated countries, as
updated by the
Department of Transport.
If anyone in our School
community develops
COVID-19 symptoms,
however mild, they will be
sent them home and they
should follow public health
advice. For pupils and staff
with symptoms, they
should avoid using public
transport and, wherever
possible, be collected by a
member of their family or
household;
13. If a child, young person or
other learner becomes
unwell with symptoms of
coronavirus while in their
school/ nursery setting and



needs direct personal care
until they can return
home. A fluid resistant (IIR
type) face mask <u>must</u> be
worn by the supervising
adult if a distance of 2
metres cannot be
maintained. If contact with
the child or young person
is necessary, then gloves,
an apron and a fluid
resistant (IIR type) face
mask <u>must</u> be worn by the
supervising adult. If a risk
assessment determines
that there is a risk of
splashing to the eyes, for
example from coughing,
spitting, or vomiting, then
eye protection (goggles or
face shield) should also be
worn. Any rooms that they
have used should be
cleaned after they have
left;
14. All staff members are
strongly encouraged to
continue to twice weekly
LFD test at their homes.
School Management will
strongly encourage parents
and other visitors to take a



lateral flow device (LFD) test
before entering the School;
L5. Staff and pupils with a
positive LFD test result
should self-isolate in line
with the stay-at-home
guidance. They will also
need to get a free PCR test
to check if they have
COVID19. Whilst awaiting
the PCR result, the individual
should continue to self-
isolate. If the PCR test is
taken within 2 days of the
positive lateral flow test,
and the PCR result is
negative, it overrides the
self-test LFD test and the
pupil/ staff member can
return to school, as long as
the individual doesn't have
COVID-19 symptoms.
L6. School Management can
now plan to undertake
