School Attendance Matters

Regular school attendance is one of the most crucial indicators of a student's success. Simply put, students cannot learn if they are not present. Those who attend school regularly have a much better chance of achieving academic success.

Consider the following example: a student who starts in Reception and misses an average of 10 days per year until they leave Year 6 will miss a total of 70 days. While this may not seem like a significant problem, it adds up to nearly an entire term of school missed.

Now, compare this to a student with more serious attendance issues, missing an average of 25 days per year. This student will have missed 175 days by the time they finish Year 6 - almost a whole year of schooling.

It is no surprise that students with poor attendance often fall behind academically compared to their peers with satisfactory attendance. This highlights the importance of regular attendance for every student's educational journey.
