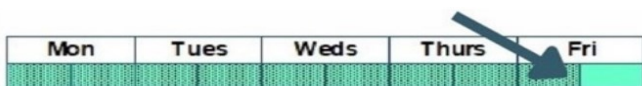

What is Persistent Absence?

A child who only attends school for 90% or less of the time is classed as a Persistent Absentee.

90% might sound great, but Stephen's story shows us why it's not:

Stephen is a child who attends school for 90% of the time. His parents think this is quite good. 90% attendance is the same as being absent from school for a half day every week.



If Stephen's attendance for all the years he went to school was 90%, he would have missed 209 days of school, that's more than a whole school year!

Attending regularly would not only help Stephen succeed in school, but he would also develop his social skills, have more friends, develop better oracy skills, be more active and healthy and he will ultimately succeed in later life.

So why does persistent absence matter?

Missing school has a huge impact on how well a pupil gets on at school. The more school a child misses, the harder it is for them to get into a routine of attending regularly and catch up on the work they have missed.

What can I do?

1. Be honest. Every parent struggles at some point, no parent is perfect! If you're having difficulties with your child, seek help. Our Reception and website is a great place to start.
2. Engage with us. Speak to your child's class teacher, Mrs Anderson and our reception staff. We will look to identify obstacles to regular attendance and there are lots of solutions to every difficulty.
3. Walk to and from school with other families.
4. Consider our breakfast club and after-school clubs to help make collection times more manageable.
